Most of the time, children doing extra-curricular activities out of school are either skills that they are unable to take part in at school, for example swimming, or an extra course of something they enjoy, like an art club. These often include – shrewdly or subtly – life skills and learning about the world around them. This also includes problems and how to solve them, for example learning about recycling and climate change. These can help develop children's understanding of the world and aid them expand their knowledge of things they would like to learn about, which will help them in their future.
